COVID -19 PROTOCOLS AND PROCEDURES

Protocols regarding the management of the COVID-19 Pandemic will be sent out to all entered exhibitors before the show, or alternately handed out at the entrance gate, in order to ensure we have the most up-to-date information available for everyone. All exhibitors will be expected to adhere to the protocols put in place by the Lakes District Kennel Club, without exception. Anyone not adhering to the protocols will be directed to leave the show grounds immediately, and there will be no refund of entry or camping fees.

OVERNIGHT RV PARKING BY RESERVATION

Exhibitors may enter the show grounds starting at **1:00 pm on Thursday, July 21 2022.**
All exhibitors must be cleaned up and off the fairgrounds no later than **8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, July 26th**



CAMPING AT THE SHOW SITE

Ringside Camping Sites (30'x50' max) - \$35/night (will be numbered & assigned before the gates open)

- *We have a limited number of ringside camping sites. They will be available on a first booked/paid basis.*
- *All bookings for ringside spots must be for a minimum of 4 nights (Thursday through Sunday, July 21 to July 24) but can be extended to include Sunday night.*

General Camping Sites (30 x 50') - \$20/night (first come, first serve): *Campers will be parked as you arrive so if you want to camp together it is best to arrive together otherwise we can't guarantee our ability to hold a space next to you for your friend.*

Day Tenting - \$10/day (sites will be approximately 20'x20' and your vehicle may be parked at your site within the boundaries) *in designated area only; pop up and any other equipment/items may be left overnight at exhibitor's risk.*

Day vehicle parking will be available at no charge, in designated area only.

All reservations for overnight camping and day tenting will be made directly with the Show Chair (Candice Little) by email at tlakelabs@gmail.com. Please include the dates you are reserving, whether or want ringside or general camping, the type of RV you have, and the length. These reservations will be accepted in the order they are received. Payment in full (via etransfer) will be required once successful entry to the show is confirmed. Failure to pay within 48 hours of entries being confirmed or the show closing will result in your reservation being cancelled.

THERE IS NO POWER AVAILABLE ON SITE FOR CAMPERS

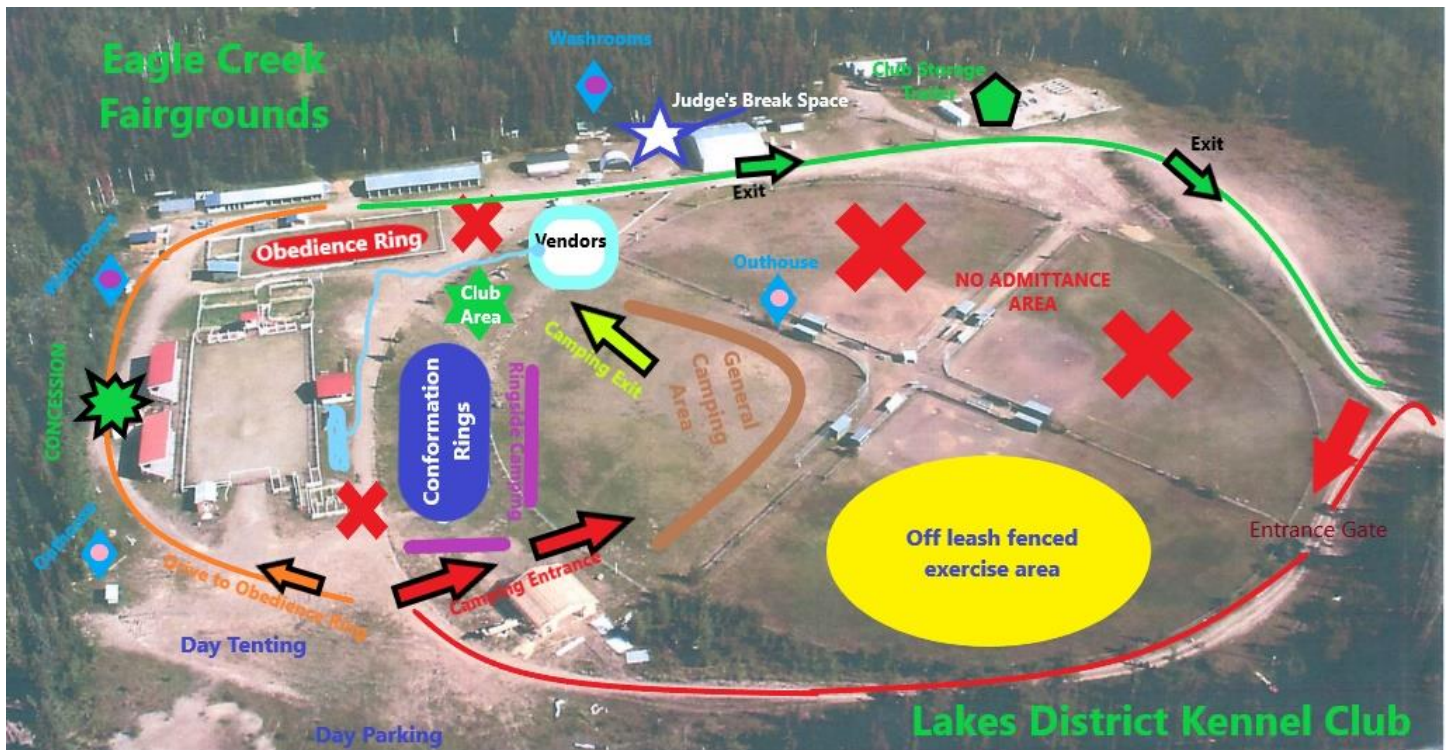
There is a sani-dump in Burns Lake, if needed. There is no sani-dump available on site but there is one in Burns Lake (about 10 minutes from show site).

Quiet time is 11:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. – generators may not be operated during these hours

Jack plates will be required, as well as platforms for generators, to preserve the grounds.

Please ensure your generator exhaust does not compromise the neighbouring RV's.

NOTE: *All overnight campers will be expected to provide a \$50 deposit when they enter the grounds and, provided you have left your site in good shape, we will return your \$50 as you check out and leave the grounds. This can be in the form of cash or a cheque made out to the Lakes District Kennel Club.*

BEST OWNER-HANDLED DOG IN GROUP AND SHOW

The handler of the dog must be the owner of record or a direct family member. The owner must show the dog at all levels of competition. This competition is open to non-professionals only. Anyone who has handled dogs in a professional capacity in the past 2 years is not eligible to participate.

There are no additional fees for this event. Participants do not need to pre-register but the dogs must be entered in a regular conformation class.

DATES: **Friday, Saturday, and Sunday**

TIME: **Following Puppy in Group and Puppy in Show**

Owner-Handled competition is an unofficial class. Participants do not need to pre-register but will need to inform the ring steward following the breed judging that they are the owner. The handler of the dog must be the owner for the classes. Only owner-handled dogs that receive a Best of Breed ribbon are eligible to compete in the Best Owner Handled Dog in Group. The winner of BOH in breed may compete in BOH in Group unless the dog was already defeated at the Best in Group level, by another owner-handled dog. The winner of BOH in Group will compete in BOH in Show after the completion of Best Puppy in Show unless the dog was already defeated, at the Best in Show level, by another owner-handled dog that is entered in this competition.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following classes will be provided, divided by sex.

REGULAR CLASSES

JUNIOR PUPPY - 6 months & under 9 months on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY- 9 months & under 12 months on the day of the show

12-18 MONTH CLASS - for dogs 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED - for dogs born in Canada, Champions in any country excluded.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR - shall be for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder.

OPEN CLASS - shall be for all Dogs.

SPECIALS ONLY - This class will NOT be divided by sex. A dog may be entered for “Specials Only” and such dog shall compete for Best of Breed award. If eligible it must compete for the award of Best of Opposite Sex. All awards the dog earned at the show will be cancelled if, at the time of closing of entries for the show, the dog was not registered individually in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club or if the dog has not earned all the championship points required for championship status. The entry of a Listed Dog in this class is NOT allowed.

EXHIBITION ONLY - Dogs entered in this class may not compete in the regular breed classes.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

BABY PUPPY -3 months & under 6 months on the day of the show

VETERANS CLASS - In this optional class for All Breed Shows, dogs must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered. The awards for this class are: Best Male Veteran and Best Female Veteran Best Veteran in Breed Best Veteran in Group Best Veteran in Show A Veteran awarded Best Veteran in Breed is not required to stay to compete for Best Veteran in Group. A Veteran awarded Best Veteran in Group is not required to stay to compete for Best Veteran in Show.

OBEDIENCE CLASSES

NOVICE “A” - No licensed handler, no trainer, nor any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its U.D. Title in Canada or Elsewhere shall be allowed to compete. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be canceled.

NOVICE “B” - Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person & shall be for pure-bred dogs of any breed which have not won the title of C.D. in Canada

OPEN HA - The Open HA class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D. but has not earned the title of C.D.X. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or member of their immediate families. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a U.D. title may not handle a dog in this class.

Open18A -The requirements are the same as Open HA and the same rules except the Long Sit is replaced with Change of Positions Exercises and the Long Dow is replaced with a Group Sit-Walk around.

OPEN HB - The Open HB class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D. Dogs which have earned the title of C.D.X. or any higher titles may enter in the.

Open 18B – The requirements are the same as Open HB and the same rules except the addition of the new Change of Positions Exercises.

UTILITY A – For any purebred dog that has not earned the title of UD. No person who has earned a MOTCH title may handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner or a member of their immediate families. Exercises will be performed in the usual order.

UTILITY B – Exercises will be done in random order. Order will be posted approximately 30 minutes prior to judging.

PRE-NOVICE – shall be for any dog which has not earned the title of P.C.D. (Pre-Companion Dog) in Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person.

NOVICE C – as Obedience Trial Rules & Regulation

COVID 19 PROTOCOLS ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE AS SUCH THE CLUB WILL FOLLOW THE CURRENT BC GOVERNMENT GUIDE LINES & PROTOCOLS AS OF THE DATE OF THE SHOWS

CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 - 5	6 - 9	10 - 12	13 +
Points Awarded	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded Winners

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that a dog was defeated at the Group level.

15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than five (5) championship points in a single show.

15.1.10 Permission shall be granted to a club or clubs to hold shows in such a way that any dog may earn three (3) sets of championship points on the same day, provided that one or more of those sets of points is awarded at a specialty for that breed or group.

15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners that also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with five (5) championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a champion and its owner provided with a championship certificate, the dog must: (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges;

(b) be registered in the records of the CKC, have an Event Registration Number (ERN) or Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN);

(c) have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

15.1.13 The Board interprets the words “earn at least 10 championship points under 3 different judges” to mean: (a) Three (3) or more Winners awards at not less than three (3) different shows, under three (3) different judges at the breed level; (b) each of the three (3) judge’s awards must be one or more championship points won at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing; (c) all points required for championship status may be earned at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Opposite Sex, Best of Breed or group placing.

As of July 2021, the rules for awarding of Grand Champion and Grand Champion Excellent have changed. Please see CKC Conformation Rule 15.2 Grand Champion (GCH) & 15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GCHEx) for details.

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available from the CKC, 400 200 Ronson Dr., Etobicoke, ON M9W 5Z9

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
4. A Judge, Ring Steward, Show Secretary, Show Superintendent, or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
6. **DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING.** The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are **PACIFIC DAYLIGHT TIME.**
7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 plus GST which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog **BEFORE** taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, pandemic and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.
13. If you are unable to attend due to COVID or any other ailment, it is your responsibility to find an alternative handler for your dog. No refund will be given.
- 14 **LDKC has a zero tolerance** of abuse of any description involving any person involved with the LDKC shows, including spectators.

COVID 19 OBEDIENCE & RALLY RULES GENERAL GUIDELINES UPDATE FOR 2022

Clubs will follow all Federal, Provincial and local health rules when holding a trial and the protocol will be detailed in the Premium List. Judges, Officials and handlers will abide by the rules specified.

The following are allowable temporary changes to the Obedience Rules & Regulations that a club may opt to use during their event in the year 2022 while operating under covid restrictions. However, any other changes to any other rule that is not mentioned here will not be allowed.

All municipal directives regarding vaccinations, mask wearing and social distancing must be upheld.

Obedience Trials

- Judges can wear a mask even if not required by the club.
- Following federal and provincial rules all the temporary rules regarding leash and dumbbell placement can be allowed. Clubs can still allow leashes and dumbbells to be placed on a table or chair determined by the judge, located in the ring such that the handler can obtain the item without leaving the ring. Sanitization, paper towels or paper are not required between equipment.
- If the club decides to use the guidelines for leash and dumbbell, the exhibitor may either leave the dog on a sit stay or heel with the dog to the location of the chair to obtain and return their leash and dumbbell used during the exercises.
- Articles will be handled as in regular rules.
- Scoresheets and awards may be given out in the ring but the club may opt to have handlers pick up scoresheets and awards outside the ring.
- It is recommended that the club publish either in the premium list or judging schedule or both, the modified rules.
- In all cases the club can choose to follow regular or covid rules as long as local and provincial health guidelines are followed.

5 Ribbons and Prizes

5.1 Ribbons and Rosettes

5.1.1 A club or association holding a trial under these rules shall provide ribbons and rosettes as specified in this section. Only those dogs earning a qualifying score will receive ribbons. The hosting club can determine how prizes and ribbons will be presented, mailing them to exhibitors will be allowed or having them available for exhibitors on a separate table for pick up or in the ring following covid distancing protocol.

8 Regulations for Performance & Judging

8.10 Scoresheets

8.10.1 At the conclusion of the judging of each class, judges are required to provide meaningfully marked individual scoresheets to each exhibitor. Scoresheets need not be handed out in the ring, but may be distributed to the exhibitor in any manner as decided by the individual club in order to follow covid protocol.

8.11 Announcement of Scores

8.11.3 After all the scores for the class are recorded, the judge shall call for all available dogs that have earned qualifying scores to be brought into the ring. This can be modified by club if needed to follow covid protocol.

8.13 Ring Procedure

8.13.9 In the Novice intermediate, Open and Utility classes the handler shall place the dumbbell and leash on a chair as designated by the judge in the ring. Utility articles shall be handled as in regular rules. Dumbbell, leash and articles shall be retrieved by the handler before leaving the ring.

Pre-Novice 9.6

Figure 8 9.6.3 In the Figure 8 exercise, the handler will stand with the dog sitting in heel position facing the judge, midway between the two stewards cones at least 0.46m (18") high, chairs or similar inanimate objects placed about 3.66m (12ft) apart. The handler may go around either steward object first. On the judge's order, the handler, with the dog on a loose leash, shall go twice completely around the Figure 8 with one halt at the end of the exercise. The handler may give the dog a verbal command to sit.

9.9 Group Sit or Down exercise

9.9.4 All dogs in the class that are eligible to compete in the group exercises may be judged separately or as part of a group after the completion of the individual exercises. If there is more than one dog completing in the group exercise, the dogs must be placed at least 2.44m (8') apart. In order to accommodate the distance requirement, there may be more than one group. A dog who fails any of the individual exercises is not eligible to compete.

9.9.5 Handler will enter the ring with their dogs on leash and line up in a straight line in catalogue order, at least 1.22m (4') 2.44m (8') apart. In order to accommodate the distance requirement, there may be more than one group. A dog

who fails any of the individual exercises is not eligible to complete. Clubs may continue to use the 8' distance if required for social distancing or use regular rules and may choose to use the rule that a dog who fails any of the individual exercises is not eligible to compete in the group exercises.

10 Novice class

10.6.8 In the figure 8 exercise, the handler will stand with the dog sitting in heel position facing the judge, midway between the two steward's cones at least 0.46m (18") high, chairs or similar inanimate objects placed about 2.44m (8') apart. The handler may go around either steward object first. On the judge's order, the handler with the dog on a loose leash shall go twice completely around the figure 8 with at least one halt during and another at the end of the exercise.

10.7 Stand for Examination

10.7.3 On completion of the Figure 8 exercise, the handler will remove the leash and give place it to a steward, who will place it on the judges table on a chair designed by the judge. If necessary, the dog may be guided gently by the collar.

10.9 Recall

10.9.7 On completion of the Recall, the handler may ask the dog to stay or may guide the dog gently by the collar in order to retrieve the leash from the chair previously designated by the judge and put it on the dog before leaving the ring. Notice to Obedience & Rally Obedience Club Page 3

10.10 Group Sit and Down exercises

10.10.4 All dogs in the class that are eligible to complete in the group exercises may be judged separately or as part of a group after the completion of the individual exercises. If there is more than one dog completing in the group exercise, the dogs must be placed at least 2.44m (8') apart. In order to accommodate the distance requirement, there may be more than one group. A dog who fails any of the individual exercises is not eligible to complete. will do so together. If, however, there are more than eight dogs completing, they will be split into groups of not more than eight. 10.10.5 When the same judge judges the Novice A, B and/or C classes, the classes may be combined provided the total number of dogs eligible to complete in the group does not exceed eight can be placed at least 2.44m (8') apart.

10.10.6 Handler will enter the ring with their dogs on leash and line up in catalogue order along on side of the ring at least 2.44m (8') apart where the judge indicates. Handlers will place their armbands, weighted with leashes behind the dogs.

10.10.8 The judge shall take a position in the ring where both the dogs and handlers can be observed but must be at least 2.44m (8') from any person. One minute after giving the order to "Leave your dogs" the judge will order the handlers to return promptly to their dogs, each walking around behind his own dog to the heel position. The dogs should not move from the sitting position until the judge says, "Exercise finished." Clubs may continue to use the 8' distance if required for social distancing or use regular rules, and may use the rule that a dog who fails any of the individual exercises is not eligible to compete in the group exercises.

12 Open class

12.7 Heel Free & Figure 8

12.7.2 covid exception recommends same as Novice Section 10.6.8 - cones at least 0.46m (18") high, chairs or similar inanimate objects may continue to be used.

4.3 Judging Schedule 4.3.2 The formula for the preparation of the judging schedule shall be based on the judging of a maximum of 15 dogs per hour. A 10-minute walk-through for each class level must be included in the scheduled judging times and walkthroughs may be extended by the judge if required. (A & B classes of each level judged by the same judge may be combined for walk-throughs.) Walk-through's will be limited to 5 exhibitors at a time who must observe 6' social distancing. If a large class is scheduled, judges will allow an additional 10-minute walk-through every two hour for the next block of dogs to be judged in the class. This must be noted in the premium list.

5 Ribbons and Prizes

5.1.3 A club or association holding a trial under these rules shall provide ribbons and rosettes as specified in this section. Only those dogs earning a qualifying score will receive ribbons. The hosting club can determine how prizes and ribbons will be presented, mailing them to exhibitors will be allowed or having them available for exhibitors on a separate table for pick up or in the ring following covid distancing protocol.

OTHER EXTRACTS FROM CONFORMATION SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

SHOW OFFICIALS – SECTION 5.1.6

A show-giving club will be held responsible during the show for the conduct of exhibitors and spectators. Any person acting in an abusive or objectionable manner must be removed from the show on complaint to the Show Superintendent.

ENTRY FORMS – SECTION 8.2.3

Entry forms received by the CKC, which are incomplete and/or contain incorrect information may result in awards being cancelled.

ENTRY FORMS – SECTION 8.2.5

An error in an age-specified class, the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

ENTRIES - SECTION 8.3.1

Every dog entered in a conformation show must be one of the following:

- a. registered with the CKC
- b. has an Event Registration Number
- c. eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- d. with the exception of Baby Puppy, if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN)

REFUSAL OF ENTRIES – SECTION 8.6.2

A Club may refuse any entry form from an exhibitor known to have tendered a dishonored cheque or declined credit card unless entries are accompanied by cash, money order or certified cheque.

DISQUALIFICATIONS – SECTION 14.1.4

Once a dog has been disqualified for any reason at a conformation show, it may not be entered or shown at another show until the dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by the dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.

INDIGNITIES - SECTION 19.7

It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.

ZERO TOLERANCE – Any individual initiating bullying tactics at the Lakes District Kennel Club Shows individuals will be asked to leave the show grounds premises immediately and for the remainder of the event (no refunds). A report will be filed with CKC and the Disciplinary Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit. Including and not limited to suspension from attending the event for a specific period of time in the future, including permanently.

Definition of Bullying: *Refers to a range of behaviors in which targeted individuals are repeatedly, and over time, treated in a mean, insulting or abusive way. Bullying can be initiated deliberately or unconsciously. The affected person may feel upset, afraid, isolated, or humiliated. The bully sometimes acts alone and sometimes as part of a group of people.*

Examples include:

- *insulting a person's skills, looks, or habits*
- *spreading false or malicious rumors, gossip, or innuendo*
- *berating/belittling an individual*
- *unwarranted criticizing or ridiculing, especially in the presence of others*
- *giving insulting nicknames*
- *engaging in practical jokes that humiliate*
- *undermining or deliberately impeding a person's work*
- *physical gesturing that intimidates, offends, degrades, or humiliates*
- *mocking a person's accent, abilities or mannerisms*
- *yelling or shouting which intimidates, coerces, or belittles*
- *intruding on a participant's privacy by pestering, spying or stalking*
- *physically abusing or threatening abuse*
- *criticising a participant persistently*
- *constantly belittling a person's opinions.*

This applies to interpersonal and electronic communications, such as email, Facebook, text messaging, Twitter and Instagram.
