Important Note Regarding Emails & Faxes

It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that any electronic submission, either email, facsimile, or any document transmitted electronically, reaches the proper authority or recipient, within the times and limits as regulated for each document in the CKC Rules & regulations. Sent fax receipts, and/or, copies of sent emails, will not be taken as evidence of receipt by recipients.

Attention USA exhibitors: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you

Non-member Participation Fees are in effect

An annual "Non-member" participation fee for Awards and Titles will be charged to a Canadian "non member" of the Canadian Kennel Club. This fee will match the fee charged for Event Registration Number.

In order to protect the Awards and Titles earned, the "non-member" will have a choice to (a) either become a CKC member; or (b) pay the "non-member" participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause All Awards and Titles to be cancelled.

Please Note: These fees only apply to dogs wholly owned by "Non-CKC" members and are not applicable to CKC members

General Information

The Pictou County Kennel Club will use care and diligence for the safety and welfare of the dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible in the event of any accident to dogs, exhibitors or spectators.

Handlers and exhibitors with several breeds must arrange for alternative handlers should judging times of different breeds conflict.

The superintendent will be in complete charge of these shows and trials.

Due to the limited amount of space, the superintendent may be required to control the number of and/or area taken up by x-pens. All exhibitors are required to co-operate with the superintendent in this regard.

It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. (Conformation Show Rules Sec. 19.7)

If because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of the PCKC, it is impossible to open or complete the Shows, no refund of entry fees will be made

Only dogs entered in the Shows & Trials will be permitted on the show premises.

Only a dog individually registered, or eligible to be registered, in the stud book of the Canadian Kennel Club may compete in these shows and trials.

Champions and championship points - chapter 15

Section 1 - a dog awarded winners at a championship show held under these rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging 0-5), and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to the dog awarded winners shall be as provided hereunder:

The system provides for additional points if the dog awarded winners also places in the group.

A class dog awarded best in show at an all breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points won at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five points at a single show.

In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship certificate, the dog must:

- earn at least 10 championship points under at least 3 different judges; &
- be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have an Event Registration Number; &
- have earned at least one 2 point win at either the breed or group level.

Patricia Craige Trotter, of Antioch, Tennessee, has been a true dog person since her childhood in Virginia. Her Vin-Melca Norwegian Elkhounds are internationally famous as both show dogs and producers. They include the top sire and dam in the breed's history and an incredible 10 breeder-owner-handled group firsts at Westminster. Her famous Ch. Vin-Melca's Vagabond is enshrined in the AKC Museum of the Dog Hall of Fame.

In 1953, Mrs. Trotter won the Gaines Research Center's Girl Show Dog Fancier of the Year award. She has won 14 Kennel Review Breeder of the Year and Owner-Handler of the Year awards, is a member of the Quaker Oats (now Nature's Recipe) Hall of Fame, and has won two Fido Awards-as Dog Woman of the Year (1991) and as Dog Writer of the Year (1998). In 2004, the AKC named her Hound Group Breeder of the Year.

Mrs. Trotter became an AKC judge in 1994, and has since judged at several national specialty shows, the 1999 Westminster show, the 2000 Morris & Essex revival, and the 2002 AKC/Eukanuba National Championship.

She is the author of the influential book *Born to Win*, and her breeding column for the AKC gazette won a 1997 Maxwell Medallion from the Dog Writers Association of America.
