To comply with CKC regulations, we will be unable to accept or substitute any entry reaching the show & trial secretaries after the closing time and date.

All entry fees should be forwarded to our Show Secretary prior to closing date. Personal cheques and money orders for full value only will be accepted, and must be made payable to: **Boston Terrier Club of Canada**

No post dated cheques accepted. A post dated cheque is one that is dated after the receipt of the entry. All NSF cheques will be Subject to a charge of \$45.00. N.S.F. cheques are considered non-payment of entry fees and are punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. All fees must be paid before the show. Important Note Regarding Emails & Faxes – it will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that any electronic submission, either email, facsimile, or any document transmitted electronically, reaches the proper authority or recipient, within the times and limits as regulated for each document in the CKC Rules & regulations. Sent fax receipts, and/or, copies of sent emails will not be taken as evidence of receipt by recipients.

Attention USA exhibitors: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. PLEASE USE SEPARATE ENTRY FORMS FOR CONFORMATION AND OBEDIENCE

The Dog Show Rules states a judge officiating at a show held under these Rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show, and it shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this Rule is effectively carried out.

A copy of the Rules pertaining to Dog Shows & Obedience Trials is available from the Canadian Kennel Club. Each exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the rules of the Canadian Kennel Club regarding their events.

Telephone entries are prohibited except in such circumstances as the Board of Directors of the CKC may otherwise authorize. Fax/on line entries and/or credit card payment will be accepted when accompanied by authorized VISA or MASTERCARD and Amex.Customers' charges that are declined will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00.

Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted. Please mail entries early to ensure that they are received before the closing date. It is recommended that you phone after you fax your entry to ensure that it was received and readable. All NSF cheques will be subject to a \$45.00 service fee.

Attention Foreign Exhibitors

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will NOT be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. Post-

dated cheques will NOT be accepted. Please DO NOT mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par" they will not be cleared by the banks. BORDER CROSSING – A Rabies Certificate is required to bring a dog into Canada, Government Regulations require a Certificate prior to entry into Canada.

Event Registration Number (ERN) Notice

All dogs that are foreign born and owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an ERN. An ERN must be obtained within 30 days of obtaining points, awards or scores to avoid cancellation. If factors beyond your control prohibit this or present a problem, please send a written request for a 30 day extension to the CKC. An ERN may be obtained by contacting the CKC at: (416) 675-5511 or Fax (416) 675-6506.

Non-member participation fee

a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee.

b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled.

c) These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members." EXTRACTS FROM CONFORMATION SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

JUDGES - SECTION 4.1.3

A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to any indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see this rule is effectively carried out. SHOW OFFICIALS – SECTION 5.1.5

A show-giving club will be held responsible during the show for the conduct of exhibitors and spectators. Any person acting in an abusive or objectionable manner must be removed from the show on complaint to the Show Superintendent. ENTRY FORMS – SECTION 8.2.3

Entry forms received by the CKC, which are incomplete and/or contain incorrect information may result in awards being cancelled.

ENTRY FORMS - SECTION 8.2.5

An error in an age-specified class, the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

ENTRIES - SECTION 8.3.1

Every dog entered in a conformation show must be one of the following:

a. registered with the CKC

b. have an Event Registration Number

c. eligible for registration with the CKC, or

d. if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous

Certification Number (MCN)

REFUSAL OF ENTRIES - SECTION 8.6.2

A Club may refuse any entry form from an exhibitor known to have tendered a dishonoured cheque or declined credit card unless entries are accompanied by cash, money order or certified cheque.

DISQUALIFICATIONS - SECTION 14.1.4

Once a dog has been disqualified for any reason at a conformation show, it may not be entered or shown at another show until the dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by the dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided here under. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

*Dogs Competing	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 & More
Points Allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded Winners

- In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.
- 15.1.3 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Breed at the show, then all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.4 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing in Specials Only shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.5 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.6 If a dog is awarded Winners only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.7 The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this section.

Clarification:

- Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Dog shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials bitches, and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated.
- 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that a dog was defeated at the group level.

- 15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than five (5) championship points in a single show.
- 15.1.10 Permission shall be granted a club or clubs to hold shows in such a way that any dog may earn three (3) sets of championship points on the same day, provided that one or more of those sets of points is awarded at a specialty for that breed or group.
- 15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners that also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with five (5) championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.
- 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a champion and its owner provided with a championship certificate, the dog must: (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges;
 - (b) be registered in the records of the CKC, have an Event Registration Number (ERN) or have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN); (c) have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.
- 15.1.13 The Board interprets the words "earn at least 10 championship points under 3 different judges" to mean:
 - (a) Three (3) or more Winners awards at not less than three (3) different shows, under three (3) different judges at the breed level; (b) each of the three (3) judge's awards must be one or more championship points won at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing; (c) all points required for championship status may be earned at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing.

Grand Champion (GCh) Point Schedule

15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

- 15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.
- 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(a) Grand Champion Point System

Points towards the Grand Champion title, at breed level, are awarded to the Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level:

(b) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx)

- 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may only be earned after the completion of the CKC grand championship title.
- 15.3.2 Points for this title may be accumulated at any time after the completion of the CKC grand championship but does not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship or the grand championship.
- 15.3.3 A minimum of 100 points, which must include one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed) plus three (3) Group 1st or three (3) breed specialty wins.

- 15 3.4 Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. For example, a dog that wins first in group and then wins Best in Show, earns 10 points, not 15.
- 15.3.5 The title of Grand Champion Excellent shall not be awarded retroactively. However, dogs that have been awarded the Grand Champion title prior to January 1, 2013, will be awarded the Grand Champion Excellent title on application to the CKC.
- 15.3.6 Additional Requirements To attain a Grand Champion Excellent title, a dog must have been awarded a CKC performance title from any CKC event. A CGN, Herding Tested certificate or Chase Ability Program title are not considered performance titles for the awarding of this title.

CONFORMATION The following classes will be provided, divided by sex.

REGULAR CLASSES: The following CKC Regular Classes will be provided for both sexes: JUNIOR PUPPY - 6 months & under 9 months on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY- 9 months & under 12 months on the day of the show

12-18 MONTH CLASS - for dogs 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED - for dogs born in Canada, Champions in any country excluded. BRED BY EXHIBITOR - shall be for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. OPEN CLASS - shall be for all Dogs Open (Divided by Weight): 15lbs, 15 – 20 lbs, 20 – 25lbs VETERANS CLASS- Dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. This class may, at the discretion of the club, be divided by age into not more than three age divided classes. Veterans do not compete for points but Go Directly to Best of Breed. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered. .

SPECIALS ONLY - A dog may be entered for "Specials Only" and such dog shall compete for Best of Breed award. If eligible it must compete for the award of Best of Opposite Sex. All awards the dog earned at the show will be cancelled if, at the time of closing of entries for the show, the dog was not registered individually in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club or if the dog has not earned all the championship points required for championship.

NON REGULAR CLASSES :

BABY PUPPY CLASS DOGS 3 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show.

BRACE- At an all-breed or specialty show a club may, but is not required to, offer a Brace Class. This class shall be for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily of the same sex). A Brace should be judged as an identical pair – same colour, size, gait, and same stride. When viewed from the side they should appear as one dog and its shadow. A brace must be handled by 1 person on 1 lead

STUD DOG & GET -shall be comprised of the stud dog and 2 or more of his get. Ownership in this class need not be identical. The stud dog may be spayed/neutered and must be entered in a Regular class or in Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular class. ments as the Stud Dog and Get class

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY- This class shall have the same requirements as Stud dog and get

EXHIBITION ONLY - Dogs entered in this class may not compete in the regular breed classes.

SWEEPSTAKES

Puppy Sweeps

Shall be for any dog 6 months up to but not including 18 months of age. To enter this class, the dog must be entered in one of the CKC regular classes or in Specials only. There will be three classes in all, divided by sex.

Baby Puppy For Dogs 3 months of age up to but not including 6 months Junior Class for Dogs at least 6 months of age up to but not including 9 months. Senior Class for Dogs at least 9 months of age up to but not including 12 months. 12-18 Open for Dogs at least 12 months of age up to but not including 18 months.

The winners of all six classes will compete for Best in Sweepstakes. A rosette will be awarded to first, second, third and fourth places in each class as well as to Best in Sweeps and Best Opposite Sex in Sweeps

25% of the total sweeps entry fees will go to the Best in Sweeps and rosette 10% of the total sweeps entry fees will go to the Best Opposite Sex in Sweeps and rosette 5% first in each class and prizes and rosette 25% will be retained for administrative purposes

VETERANS SWEEPSTAKES

Shall be for any dog 7 years of age and up. To enter this class, the dog must be entered in one of the CKC regular classes, Specials or Exhibition Only. There will be six classes in all, divided by sex.

7 up to 9 years for Dogs at least 7 years of age up to but not including 9 years
9 up to 12 years for Dogs at least 9 years of age up to but not including 12 years
12 years of age and older for Dogs 12 years of age and older

30% of the total sweeps entry fees will go to the Best in Sweeps and prizes and a rosette 15% of the total sweeps entry fees will go to the Best Opposite Sex in Sweeps and prizes and rosette 5% first in each class and prizes and a rosette 25% will be retained for administrative purposes

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

Held under CKC Rules and Regulations and as printed in the show catalogue Entries to be taken up to 1 hour prior to this event. There will be a \$2.00 fee which will be collected at the show

Junior handling is open to all persons from ages 4 up to 18 years of age on the date of competition. All Dogs must also be entered in the regular classes at the all-breed show, but need not be owned by the junior or any of his immediate family.

A rosette and suitable prize will be awarded to the winners of First in each class; flat ribbons will be given to 2nd through 4th in each class. Peewee handlers will receive a Participant ribbon and prize. A rosette and \$25.00 will be offered for Best Overall.

- A judge officiating at a show shall not be subject to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show and it is the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that this rule is effectively carried out. (Dog Show Rules, Sec. 4.1.3)
- No person may approach a judge, either directly or otherwise, orally or in writing, to favor his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the act. (Dog Show Rules Sec. 4.1.6)
- The East Hants Sportsplex and the Show Committee will use care and diligence for the welfare of the dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume and liability in the event of an accident, or other misfortune to either the dogs or exhibitors or patrons. If, because of riot or civil disturbance or any other acts beyond the control of the MGRC and their Show Committee, it is impossible to open or close the shows, no refund of entries will be made.
- Only dogs entered in the Shows & Trials will be permitted on the show premises.
- The precincts of the show shall be the areas designated where the shows and trials are being held within the Charlottetown Civic Centre.

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available from the CKC, 400 200 Ronson Dr., Etobicoke, ON M9W 5Z9

*

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.

2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.

3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.

4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.

5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.

6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed

7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.

8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 plus GST which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.

9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.

10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.

11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.

12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

13. The Club has a zero tolerance of abuse of any description involving any person involved with these shows, including spectators.
