USA EXHIBITORS

Bank drafts or money orders in Canadian Funds and personal cheques, payable in U.S. funds, and for the full amount of the entry will be accepted. Personally discounted cheques will not be honoured. Please do not mark personal cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par" as such items are not cleared through the banks. Your cooperation is appreciated.

CATALOGUES

Catalogues are available on a PRE-ORDER basis. Those who wish to pre-order at a price of \$5 may do so by indicating this on their entry form. Your catalogue will be waiting for you at the show. There will be a very limited number of catalogues available for sale at the show for \$10.

TEMPORARY COMPETITION NUMBER

A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN).

A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event.

The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN.

A TCN cannot be used for dogs that require a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN).

TCNs can be obtained:

- Online through CKC's Portal (Note: Individuals who have not yet used the online Portal will be required to create a Portal account before they can submit a TCN application online);
- By submitting a completed paper application by mail to CKC; or
- By contacting the Shows & Trials Division Toll Free: 1-855-364-7252.

Note: There is no CKC fee to obtain a TCN. However, a TCN 'listing' fee is required each time a dog with only a TCN is entered in an event.

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN).

The ERN number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event.

Fee is \$62.40 per dog, plus applicable taxes.

NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE

Effective January 1, 2011:

- a) A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC. The fee will be \$62.40 plus applicable taxes.
- b) The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual.
- c) In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.
- d) The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

CONFORMATION SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Chapter 4 Section 4.7.3 states: A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

MOVING CLASS DOGS TO SPECIALS

Chapter 8, Section 8.9 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations has been amended to allow a dog which is individually registered in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club, and has completed the requirements for a Championship, after the Closing Date for entries for a show, may be transferred from one of the Regular Classes to "Specials Only," providing the request for a transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in WRITING at least one hour prior to the judging of your breed by the owner or handler.

When one or more all-breed and/or specialty shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the request for moving of class dogs to Specials Only must be made a minimum of one (1) hour prior to the breed judging scheduled start of the show for which the dog is being moved up to Specials Only.

I CERTIFY that I am the registered owner(s) of the dog or that I am the authorized agent of the owner(s) whose name(s) I have entered above and accept full responsibility for all statements made in this entry. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry I (we) agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club and by any additional rules and regulations appearing in the premium list. Also by signing this form, I certify that I will not hold the Show giving Club, its members, directors, employees or agents liable in the event of any accident of misfortune however caused.

ENTRY INFORMATION

- 1. No entry will be accepted unless all particulars called for on the entry form are completed in full. Handlers or agents please note the full name and address of all owners must be filled in.
- 2. Incomplete entries will be returned. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by entry fees. Telephone and telegraph entries cannot be accepted. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made.
- 3. There is no refund for duplicate cheques. Every effort will be made to find all duplicate entries, however if the entry has been processed and appears in the official catalogue, no refund will be made.
- 4. Substitutions or cancellations of any entry after the closing date is prohibited. Moving Class Dogs to Specials is permitted. An error in the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show. Only dogs which are already registered in the Canadian Kennel Club Stud Book, or are eligible for such registration can be entered. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC Rules.
- 5. ENTRIES POSITIVELY CLOSE 8:00 P.M. WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 11, 2021, and must be in the hands of the Show Secretary by that date.
- 6. Identification cards and judging schedules will be mailed as soon as possible after the entries close. Identification cards must be presented upon arrival at the show.
- 7. Tendering of NSF cheques in payment of fees shall be considered non-payment of fees and is punishable by disciplinary action. Any NSF cheques will be subject to a \$35 service charge.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show which will be governed by CKC Rules.
- 2. If, because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of Entry will be made.
- 3. Dogs should arrive in adequate time for their judging (allowing for absentees) and will be excused when not required for further judging. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to have the dog at ringside when the dog's class is scheduled for judging. Waiting for dogs will not be possible and handlers with several dogs must arrange for alternate handlers.
- 4. Judging will commence at 8 a.m. A later starting time may be specified in the judging schedule. Starting time of each ring will be specified in the judging schedule.
- 5. SHOW PRECINCTS: The area set out for the show ring, including a 10-foot perimeter and the assembly area.
- 6. Please clean up after your dogs to ensure the grounds are left in proper condition.

POODLE CLUB OF ONTARIO & MINIATURE POODLE CLUB OF ONTARIO COVID-19 INFORMATION

The Poodle Club of Ontario and Miniature Poodle Club of Ontario recognize the impact and risks that COVID-19 continues to have on our community. It is important to ensure the safety of our club members, volunteers, ring stewards, judges and exhibitors. The Poodle Club of Ontario and Miniature Poodle Club of Ontario will follow all federal, provincial, municipal and facility protocols related to COVID 19. However, public-health guidelines, restrictions and show protocols may change between the posting of this Premium List and the publishing of the Judging Schedule.

By entering our show, you agree to abide by any guidelines or protocols that the Poodle Club of Ontario and Miniature Poodle Club of Ontario have in place at the time the shows are hosted. If any club members, volunteers, ring stewards, judges, or fellow exhibitors are subject to abusive language or behaviour, or if you fail to abide by the show protocols, this may result in your dismissal from the show with no right of entry refund.

Show Site & Rings

- There will be signs to indicate when you are entering the official show grounds. Entrance will have a screening station.
- There will be hand sanitizing stations located on the show grounds.
- Judge's table, in-ring grooming table, and other 'touch surfaces' will be sanitized regularly.
- There will be a separate entrances and exit for the ring.
- Exhibitors will pick up placement ribbons/prizes as they exit the ring. No recycling of ribbons.
- Chairs are not permitted at ring side to watch the show.

Masks

- Masks are mandatory while in the ring and the show precincts. Masks must be worn completely, covering both mouth and nose.
- If you do not bring a mask, one will be provided for you at a cost (limited supply).
- Face shields, neck warmers, masks with exhalation valves, handkerchiefs and any other loose fitting face coverings are NOT masks.
- Anyone unable to wear a mask due to a medical condition will require a medical exception letter from an *authorized health professional*. You must be able to show the letter to the Show Secretary. In this case, the exhibitor would be required to wear a face shield.

Social Distancing

- Maintain at least 2 metres (6 feet) of social distancing while at the show venue. The Poodle Club of Ontario and Miniature Poodle Club of Ontario are ensuring extra space is provided in the rings and surrounding area so that adequate space is available to socially distance.
- No hugging or handshaking permitted on any of the official grounds of the show.
- Wash hands and use hand sanitizer as frequently as possible.
- Do not touch dogs that are not your own.

Refund Policy

- If the show is cancelled due to COVID-19 regulations, 80% of the entry fee will be returned to exhibitors.
- All service fees The Entry Line and credit cards are non-refundable.
- If you are unable to attend the dog show, for any reason, after entries have closed, refunds will not be provided.
- If you cannot travel to the show due to a government restriction on travel, refunds will not be provided.

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5
*includes the doa awarded Winners						

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge <u>SHALL NOT</u> be included in the calculation for championship points.

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed, or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above.

Section 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points, provided that a dog was defeated at the group level.

Section 15.1.11 A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed Championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

GRAND CHAMPIONS AND GCH POINTS

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated

based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

- c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.
- d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Section 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

GRAND CHAMPION EXCELLENT AND GCHEX POINTS

The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

Section 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

- a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed).
- b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.
- c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

Section 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, three (3) Group wins, or three (3) Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.

SPECIALTY CONFORMATION CLASSES BOTH SEXES

REGULAR CLASSES:

JUNIOR PUPPY – A dog between 6 months and under 9 months on day of show.

SENIOR PUPPY – A dog between 9 months and under 12 months on day of show.

12-18 MONTHS – A dog between 12 months and under 18 months on day of show.

CANADIAN BRED - A dog born in Canada.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR – Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The breeder/owner must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN CLASS – For all dogs.

VETERANS CLASS – For all dogs over 7 years of age as of the date of the show. These dogs to compete for the regular placements, and the 1st-place dog and bitch will go on to compete for Best of Breed. Veterans may be broken down into separate age categories. The winner of the Veterans Class will not compete for points but go directly into the Best of Breed competition. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.

SPECIALS ONLY – Dogs that are Canadian Champions.

NON-REGULAR & UNOFFICIAL CLASSES:

BABY PUPPY – A dog between 4 months and under 6 months on day of show. Baby Puppies do not compete for points.

EXHIBITION ONLY – All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in Regular competition. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular/Unofficial classes and/or Parades.

From the South: Take Trafalgar Road (Hwy 125) through Hillsburgh. North of Hillsburgh is a set of lights at Dufferin Road 3. Turn left on Dufferin Road 3 (towards Belwood) and follow it through Marsville. Turn right on the 10th Line (East Garafraxa). Travel 4.2 km (Fire # 072117 and mailbox with name is on the left past the laneway – back up).

From Southwest: Take Hwy 6 to Fergus. Turn right at the lights by Shopper's Drugmart. This is Belsyde Road (also called Wellington County Road 18) out of Fergus. It goes past the arena. Keep heading east and turn left on the third sideroad past the fl ashing light at Wellington Road 26 (4.2 km). This is 10th Line (East Garafraxa). Turn left (north). Travel 4.2 km (Fire # 072117 and mailbox with name is on the left past the laneway – back up).

From the East: Coming from Toronto, the best route is to take the 410 out of the city. It becomes Hwy 10, which will bring you to Orangeville. Once you get to Orangeville, take the bypass for Hwy 109 towards Arthur. Follow Hwy 109 out of Orangeville towards Arthur for about 20 km. Just past the light at the turnoff for Grand Valley, turn left on Dufferin Road 5 (towards Belwood) and follow it around the big curve to the right. Turn left on the second road after the curve. This is 10th Line (East Garafraxa). Come down the hill and across the bridge and we are the second laneway on the left after the bridge (Fire # 072117 and mailbox with name is on the right).

From the West: Coming from Arthur just follow Hwy 109 towards Orangeville. The roads on the right (south side) are labelled incrementally, just turn right on the 10th Line, come through 2 stop signs, down the hill and across the bridge and we are the second laneway on the left after the bridge. (Fire # 072117 and mailbox with name is on the right).
